

COURSE DESCRIPTION
SIXTH GRADE
BIBLE

Philosophy Statement: The Bible is the foundations of the Christ-centered life. Through careful study and memorization of the Bible, we will develop and defend a Christian world-view, identify and live God's purposes for our life, and grow in Christian character and God's grace. The fruit of this study will be "that the man of God will be adequate and equipped for any good work" II Timothy 3:14-17.

Objectives: Students will conduct an in-depth study in the New Testament focusing on the principles for Christian living from the example of the early church as recorded in the book of Acts. Students will be impacted by the lives and actions of heroic men and women who faced danger, persecution, and trials in order to carry a flame of faith into a dark world. Students will be strengthened as they participate in activities to help them apply the scriptures to important issues faced by sixth graders.
